In recent years, concerns have been raised about the standards of practice and quality control in cleaning, disinfection and sterilization (CD&S) in various hospitals all over the world. Failure to implement best practice standards and quality control in CD&S has major implications for transmission of infections to hospital patients and implied risk to the community.



North Zone TOT Workshop on Adolescent Care

First North Zone Workshop for Training of Trainers on 'Adolescent Care in Office Practice' was organized by the department of Pediatrics. The pediatricians were trained in dealing with adolescent problems during interactive sessions and three different workstations.



Echocardiography Update

Echocardiography update CME & Workshop under the aegis of Cardiological Society of India (Punjab & Chandigarh Chapter) & International Society of Cardiovascular Ultrasound was held on 5th October, 2011. Departmental Profile

"No prescription is complete without a drug!"

Pharmacology forms an essential component of medical sciences and it contributes to all the specialities and super specialities.

The foundation of the department was laid by Late Dr Gurdev Singh in 1966 as a part of LSMF course. He continued to steer the department when the course was converted to MBBS in 1974. The reins of the department were handed over to Dr KC Mishra and then Dr (Mrs.) KB Minocha. From 1976 to 2000, the department was headed by Dr (Mrs.) Chanchal Gupta. She is credited with starting MD (Pharmacology) course in 1977. The steady progress was continued by Dr SC Chopra, a teacher par excellence, who became head in 2000. The MD course was recognized by MCI in 2007. He is a pioneer in starting a number of workshops for postgraduates including Statistics, Thesis Writing, Computer Training etc.

At present

The good work of his predecessors is being taken forward by Dr Sandeep Kaushal who took over as head in 2009. Several new facilities have been added since. Drug Information Centre was started in 2009. The department has been recognized as the first ADR monitoring Centre in Punjab under Pharmacovigilance Programme of India (PvPI) since 2010. MCI has permitted increase in MD seats from 2 to 4 per year.

- First Drug Information Centre (DIC) in the region started in 2009.
- Monthly Drug Update: regarding recently approved drugs and newer indications, adverse drug reactions, warnings or withdrawal of medicines, and a brief review about a group of drugs since August 2009.
- A two bedded Clinical Pharmacology Unit with multi-parameter recorders.



- ADR monitoring Centre, working under Pharmacovigilance Programme of India (PvPI). It collects data on adverse events from wards and ICUs.
- Support for conduct of phase II trials.
- Drug Utilization studies and Prescription Audit conducted periodically.
- Drug formulary for the entire hospital has been prepared.
- The faculty also participates in :

National ADR Monitoring Centre


The department of Pharmacology has the distinction of developing the first Adverse Drug Reaction Monitoring Centre in the state of Punjab under PvPI (Pharmacovigilance Programme of India) since December 2010. Dr Sandeep Kaushal is Coordinator, Dr Kirandeep Kaur is Deputy Coordinator and Mr. Mohammad Shami is Technical Associate of the centre. All team members have been trained in recording ADRs and use of e-resources at National Coordinating Centre (NCC), Indian Pharmacopoeia Commission (IPC), Ghaziabad.

The centre is working in collaboration with various clinical departments.


- ➡ Before starting the reporting of ADRs, Nursing staff, Residents and Consultants of the hospital are sensitized to the identification and need for reporting ADRs and the methodology to be adopted for filling the form. The centre has prepared an abbreviated ADR form so that filling of the elaborate CDSCO form does not become hindrance in the reporting of ADRs.
- ➡ Brief information about the suspected adverse events and the medicines administered is provided by the Residents or Consultants on the abbreviated ADR form along with patient demographics.
- The technical associate at the centre visits the clinical departments daily and collects the forms from the reporting consultants.
- → The CDSCO ADR forms are filled in consultation with the reporting doctor followed by the Causality Assessment to determine the relationship of the event with the medicine.
- Using Vigiflow software, the completed form is electronically uploaded into the International Database at WHO Monitoring Centre, Uppsala, Switzerland.

The centre answers queries from the co-professionals from 8.30 am to 4.30 pm on all working days. The queries can be made on phone (9876500718) or sent by email (dicdmch@gmail.com) to "The Drug Information Centre". The response is provided as soon as possible or latest by 24 hours. The facility is presently for DMCH faculty and residents only, and will be extended to other doctors in due course.

Bulletin: The centre also releases a monthly newsletter since August 2009 which contains the latest information about withdrawal of any drug or newly reported adverse effect with any drug. Another component is a brief update about a group of drugs highlighting clinically important information.









Special Services

Joint Replacement Surgery

Department of Orthopaedics, is a specialized area catering to patient with all kind of diseases of joints & musculoskeletal system. The department started performing complex surgery of joint replacement of hip, knee, elbow and ankle way back in 1990 when it was not being performed in most of the health centres of the region. At present the Department, headed by Dr M Yamin, has a team of 6 highly trained arthroplasty surgeons.

Most common joints which need replacement are hip $\boldsymbol{\theta}$ knee. The common reasons are:-

- 1. Osteoarthritis
- 2. Rheumatoid arthritis
- 3. Stiff joints after complex fracture
- 4. Old healed infection.
- 5. Congenital deformities

Outcome of joint replacement surgery

- The patient has pain free joint.
- ▲ Deformity is corrected and limb length discrepancy, if any, is corrected.
- ▲ Patient has near normal range of motion.
- Patient can perform almost all kinds of physical activities including sports
- ▲ Since mobility is restored, many secondary ailments like diabetes, heart problems and hypertension can be either prevented or better managed.
- ▲ Patient can be back to his/her job or business within 2 or 3 weeks of surgery.

Highlights at DMCH


Currently the department is performing joint replacement in the newly constructed state-of-the-art operation theatres with latest techniques which include small incisions, latest instruments & high quality Implant.

The department provides excellent post operative physical rehabilitation facilities enabling the patient to walk the very next day.

The latest implants are being used which include high flex knee, gender specific knees and latest ceramic on hip joints.

Revision Joint Replacement

The surgeons are fully trained and experienced to redo or correct joint replacements which have failed or have not been given satisfactory result to the patient.
